

The sanctity of the church requires that we have an attitude of reverence.

The Apostle Paul says, "Let all things be done decently and in order" when Christians gather for prayer (1 Cor. 14:40.)

To this end, the following rules have been laid down for guidance.

- Only appropriate clothing should be worn to church as required by the holiness of the place. Women should exercise Christian modesty and decency and not come in dresses that are too short or revealing. Our Eastern rite does not permit men or woman to wear hats in church. No one is permitted to wear shorts to our Liturgies.
- Always come to church for the beginning of the service. Use the side aisles to take your seat if you are arrive after the priest has walked down the aisle to the altar. Also do not enter the church during the reading of the gospel or the consecration, remain in the foyer until it is finished and then go quietly to your pew
- If you see friends and acquaintances in church, greet them with a silent bow. Please do not stop to shake hands or ask questions. While in church you should stand when the Missal directs you to stand, not sit. Only if you are ill or very weak is it permitted to sit down.
- Eating or drinking is not acceptable. Chewing gum is absolutely prohibited.
- We love children at Our Lady of Lebanon and welcome them with open arms, however children should refrain from running in church aisles and the hall. This is a safety issue for all. A child running through the church and hall may not be a concern to most people, but for an elderly person who is shaky on their feet and terrified of a broken hip, a running child poses a very serious threat. Parents are ultimately responsible for the behavior of their children. We will expect parents to keep their children under control during public gatherings and to make sure that their children are always under adult supervision.
- The crying room is reserved for disruptive children, babies and their parents
- When preparing for funerals we ask that the family speak with the pastor prior to finalizing arrangements with the funeral home. Father Simon may be reached at 412-973-1763.
- Due to the high demand for weekend Masses, we will no longer be able to schedule one intention per mass. Effective
 immediately 40 Day and 1st year anniversary Masses will take precedence. This means they will be added to a previously
 scheduled Mass intention. You will still need to call and schedule a date for you Mass, we will not presume to pick a date
 for you. This gives you the ability to memorialize your recently deceased on or close to the anniversary date.
- Please call Father Simon at 412-973-1763 if you or a family member has been admitted to a hospital and wish to receive the Sacraments.
- Any donations or collections should be placed in the collection basket or given directly to the pastor.
- There will be a fee for the use of the church for any event that is not a Liturgy.

HALL & KITCHEN GUIDELINES

- Bingo will be cancelled for adverse weather conditions or church holy days only.
- Hall rentals are on a fee schedule and need to be approved by the pastor. The fee varies according to the number of days, utilities and kitchen equipment being used.
- Expectations are that equipment, space and supplies will be left in the same or better condition than they were found.
 Parishioners are asked to replace any supplies used from the church pantry and return items that were borrowed from the church in a reasonable amount of time. Persons renting the hall may be asked to accept responsibility for accidental or intentional damage to church property or equipment.
- When planning an event please include enough help to clean up afterwards. We do not employ a janitor and we cannot guarantee that community service volunteers will be there to assist you.
- All leftovers must be taken home and all dishes and utensils returned to storage.
- Children under the age of 18 are not permitted in the kitchen at anytime due to safety issues.
- Events open to non-parishioners require that anyone who works in the kitchen must wash their hands and have their hair and beards covered. Gloves must be worn in the preparation of food. Please ask visitors to the kitchen to step outside and you will be happy to visit with them in the hall.
- When the kitchen is being used by a parishioner we ask that you refrain from entering the kitchen to wash your hands or throw refuse into trash cans. We will make every effort to have enough trash cans in the hall and soap and paper towels in the restrooms.
