<div> <div>LETTER FROM FR. YOUSSEF ON CHURCH RE-OPENING</div> <div> <p>Beloved parishioners,</p> <p>I pray that you are all in good health and spirit. We have gone through a very difficult time these last few months, and I am grateful for how everyone has been working together to get through the pandemic. We are all hopeful that the quarantine will soon be relaxed to a point where we can begin to expand church services for the Parish. But please understand that this will have to be done in stages, with limitations that will slowly be relaxed.</p> <p>You should have received an email with a survey that was prepared with members of the Parish Council to help understand all of your concerns. Thank you to all of those who took the time to share their thoughts. I have been in contact with Bishop Gregory, and we have discussed the many issues that exist with reopening public masses during this time. He has advised us that every parish must adhere to the restrictions in place for their particular area. Since the Lehigh Valley is among the hardest hit areas in Pennsylvania, we have to do more to protect our parishioners and mass attendees.</p> <p>The Diocese of Allentown has formulated guidelines in consideration of the Governor’s policies which have been reviewed by both Bishop Gregory and me. After much consideration, we have decided to adopt many of these provisions for our parish as well. The Governor’s office has given local churches great discretion to develop policies that allow masses to resume safely, and the Diocese of Allentown has taken advantage of that opportunity. A copy of our guidelines is attached for you to read fully. These adopted will be effective on Monday, June 1, 2020, as our area enters the “yellow phase” of the quarantine. We will begin having weekday masses on Tuesday, June 2, 2020.</p> <p>Many of your concerns have been about whether there be a limit on the number of people at mass and whether we will have to wear masks. I can tell you that the guidelines will certainly require the answers to be yes. Right now, mass attendance will be limited to only 25 percent of room capacity, and masks will need to be worn at all times within the building.</p> <p>Please understand that I am eager to return to normal and to be able to allow all of us to celebrate the Holy Eucharist together as a parish family again, but as a family we must remember that we need to take care of each other. I especially know that the issue of masks is one about which a number of us have strong opinions, but we must remember, the mask is not so much for the person wearing it but to protect those around them. It is to prevent one of us from giving it to someone else. Even if we were to ask those people with health issues to not come to church yet and watch from home, they are still at risk if their family members come to mass. Remember, many of us may have the virus and not know it, because we don’t feel sick. We cannot have family members giving this to someone sick in their own family, because they got it at Mass and didn’t know it. So, if we wear masks, we can limit this risk tremendously. It is a sacrifice we must make for each other as a parish family, and as a Lebanese community. I am asking that you please understand that we have to strictly enforce this policy. There can be no exceptions for the current phase.</p> <p>As I stated, the church will restrict occupancy in the room to 25 percent of the capacity, which we will set at 70 people. This will also involve social distancing with immediate families (parents and children) sitting together but keeping a safe distance in the pews from other parishioners and families. If there is an excess of 70 people, we are prepared to have a live stream video in the church hall and create room for another 70 people. We will also add an additional mass on Sunday at noon, which will be given in Arabic only. This way, we can try to accommodate all of our people who want to come in person. Please remember that you will still be able to watch the mass on Facebook stream during this time, but we want to make in person attendance available for those who want to come back. We want you to be able to receive communion again, although we will now allow you to carefully receive it by hand in a sanitary manner.</p> <p>I would like to bring to your attention to other policies put into place during the “yellow phase”:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Confessions will be by appointment only so that we can limit the number of people waiting at any given time. The Crying Room will be closed. Offertory collections will not be made during mass. However, baskets will be available at the front and rear of the church for your offertory envelopes. We will not have Altar Servers, and there will be no sign of peace exchanged to the parishioners from the altar. <p>Again, Bishop Gregory and I are asking everyone in our parish to please work together to follow these guidelines. For example, if we reach a limit of 70 people in the main church, we would welcome you to please join us in the hall and share the liturgy with us in that way. It is not what any of us would prefer to have to do, but we must work together to keep each other safe. Please, take these guidelines with responsibility.</p> <p>And again, if anyone is in need of anything during this time, please call me. God bless you all!</p> <p>Fr.
