

Reverend and Dear Monsignors and Fathers, Deacons and Subdeacons, Brothers and Sisters;

Christ is Risen!

Certainly, we are profoundly saddened at the passing of our Holy Father, Pope Francis. At the same time, we are in need of some liturgical and practical directives. Therefore, the first message below is statement from Bishop Gregeory. That will be followed by the practical norms related to the death of the Pope.

Message of Bishop Gregory Mansour

Our beloved Pope Francis "has returned to the home of the Father."

These words from Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Camerlengo of the Holy See, remind us of our beginning and our end. We begin our earthly lives with God, and we return to God.

They also remind us of our own pilgrimage on this earth, whereby all of us, as in the story of the Prodigal Son, have a loving Father to return to, who is ready to embrace us and welcome us with joy.

Pope Francis has shown the world the face of that Merciful Father by every word and gesture of his Pontificate. He has taught us that we are all welcome in the Father's house. May our Holy Father now enjoy that embrace of our Heavenly Father, and may he rest in peace.

Liturgical and Practical Guidelines

The following two directives have been issued by the Patriarchal Liturgical Commission:

- During the Mass, at the first Intercession in the Eucharistic Prayer, the name of the deceased Pope is not to be mentioned. Instead, the prayer begins with the mention of the Patriarch and the local Bishop, and the prayer continues as indicated in the liturgical text.
- Before the final Intercession for the faithful departed, a special Intercession is to be inserted according to the following formula:

O Lord, be merciful to Pope Francis. Reward him with those who do good, for his faithful and wise service to the Church and to all of humanity. Receive him into the dwellings of your heavenly Jerusalem. Grant him a place in your Fatherly house and the vision of your eternal happiness. We pray to you, O Lord.

Bishop Gregory has asked that the following norms also be observed:

- In the Untied States, it is customary in many places that upon the death of the Pope, a black drape (bunting) is placed above and around the main door of Catholic Churches. In view of the fact that the Great Feast of the Resurrection takes precedence over all other commemorations, and as we are further celebrating "Bright Week," it would not be appropriate to implement this custom.
- A picture of Pope Francis may be placed in a an appropriately prominent place in the church (not on the main altar). The picture may be draped in black, or adorned with flowers, or some other form of suitable devotion.
- 3. The traditional Nine Days of Mourning for Pope Francis will begin on the day of his funeral, Saturday, April 26, and end on Sunday May 4. During this time, you are asked to celebrate a Divine Liturgy in your parish, for the repose of his soul, preferably not on a Sunday. Again, because it is Easter Season, do not use black vestments. The Divine Liturgy to be used is the "Commemoration of the Priests" (Book of Offering p. 147).
