


2025 recipients of the Holy Name Society/ St. Theresa Sodality High School Scholarship.

We congratulate them and their families on this well-deserved honor.







The Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Saint John 21:15-19

Pope Leo XIV Elected First American Pope

We joyfully embrace the news that Pope Leo XIV has been called by God and his fellow cardinals to lead Catholics worldwide.

Addressing the faithful gathered in St. Peter's Square, his first words were a heartfelt "Peace be with you." As he concluded his speech, he invited everyone to join him in prayer, saying, "So I would like to pray together with you: let us pray together for this new mission, but also for the whole

Church and for peace in the world. Let us ask for this special grace from Mary, our Mother."

In this spirit, let us all unite in prayer, especially for peace in the Middle East, and extend our warmest congratulations to Pope Leo XIV as the 267th successor of Saint Peter.

Pope Leo's inaugural Mass will be held Sunday, May 18 in St. Peter's Square at 4:00 AM Eastern Standard Time

Starting Thursday, May 1st, we will gather each weekday evening at 7:00 PM to pray the rosary, followed by the Benediction to Our Mother, Mary. On Saturdays and Sundays the rosary will be said 30 minutes before the Liturgy.

Our Mother Mary

In May, the month of beauty and flowers, believers gather daily in church around Mary, our Mother and Mother of Lights, as a token of their love and filial attachment to her. The daily celebration of the Marian month includes praise to God, prayers, and hymns enumerating all the virtues of the Ever-Virgin Mary, our Mother, whom God "chose above all the women of the world" (Gurat Al Irnran). They ask God for the grace of salvation from sins and seek the intercession and favor of the Virgin Mary for many diverse blessings, both spiritual and temporal, after having asked forgiveness of the Divine Majesty, seeking mercy and repentance for their sins, sholicomings, and mistakes.



In 1683, His Holiness Pope Innocent XI published a papal letter in which he declared the month of May to be dedicated to honoring our Mother, the Virgin Mary, and it is called the Marian Month.

The Virgin Mary is compassionate toward her sons and daughters, and extends her blessed hands to rescue her children who seek refuge in her from the distress and trials in this valley of tears. The Virgin, the mother of mankind throughout the generations, does not tolerate the misfortunes of time tossing us about without a supporter. While the heavens above smile upon her, and humanity yearns for her, the Virgin descends from heaven to earth, bringing to tormented humanity that which will mend their broken healis and instill in them hope and trust in the fatherhood of God.

Therefore, the Virgin Mary descends to earth in the village of Medjugorje (in Bosnia and Herzegovina), on the twenty-fifth of every month, and appears to the lucky visionary, "Marija," whom she has chosen to be her eloquent tongue for us: to call the world to faith, repentance, and reconciliation, and to spread the message of peace.

Here is the message of the Virgin Mary in Medjugorje to the world on April 25, 2025: "My dear children, the winds of anxiety, selfishness, and sin are sweeping through many hearts, leading them to confusion and destruction. Therefore, I call you, little ones: Return to God and to prayer. May you be well in your hearts and in the land on which you live."

Our Mother Mary! You are the most brilliant light of May! Whoever contemplates your life story deeply will join the angels... and abandon the world and live searching for the secrets of the supernatural... He will outstrip the ages and travel deep into the depths of the inhabited world... Then all his fears will dissipate, and the evils that had crept into his soul will vanish. He will direct his gaze day and night to the heavens and live in joy. He will not waste his life in vain... and his thoughts will become immersed in the depths of deep oceans...

Our Mother Mary! With the advent of May, we, through your intercession, offer our prayers, awaiting God's mercy for a better and more fulfilling world for us as individuals and as communities... without the obstacles imposed on us by oppressive systems that restrict human freedom to initiate, plan, and implement. Help us, Heavenly Mother, to hasten to do good in this world and the hereafter.

Our Mother Mary! I remain silent before your majesty, and I content myself with calling you: "The Creator's masterpiece among His creatures."

May the whole world be well every year, through the intercession of our mother and queen, the Virgin Mary!
