Reported Miracle in Naples, Italy

On July 24th, 2025, Msgr. Pasquale Silvestri said a Mass at St. Ferdinand Church in Naples, Italy in celebration of the feast of Saint Sharbel Makhlouf. In preparation for this feast, the Maronite Curia sent a large bottle of oil that had been blessed at St. Sharbel's tomb to the church so that its pastor, Msgr. Silvestri, could anoint attendees after communion.

500 people ultimately came to the Mass, and at the time of anointing, Msgr. Silvestri grew concerned that he would run out of the blessed oil due to the size of the crowd. When the bottle had been emptied, he returned it to its case but shortly realized that, somehow, it had been filled with the same fragrant oil again, and it weighed more than it had before.

Since this occurred, Msgr. Silvestri has reported the miraculous incident to Father Elias Hamhoury, former postulator of the cause for canonization of St. Sharbel, and Fr. Silvestri has since received a handful of reports of healings since the Mass took place.

The bottle of the oil has been saved so that it will be available for possible analysis by ecclesial or scientific authorities in case anyone wants to examine its contents. Church authorities have not issued a stance on the reports. Read more @ EWTN or CNA
